Certified Nurse Assisting (NAHA 1008)

70 hours

Students who complete this course will learn a holistic approach to safely care for patients in a variety of settings. They will develop a basic understanding of how health care systems operate and how to function efficiently within a facility. After completing this course and passing a state examination, you will play an essential role in the health care team by observing, reporting and performing skills learned within this course. Most importantly, you will understand how to work as a health care team member in meeting the patient's needs.

Competencies

- Safely care for patients and residents in a variety of health care settings.
- Acquire the knowledge and skills needed to pass the state CNA examination.
- Acquire the skills and knowledge necessary to be an essential part of the health care team and meet the needs of the patients and residents.

CNA Clinicals (NAHA 1016)

25 hours

Students enrolled in the clinical portion of the Certified Nursing Assistant course will be able to gain experience through the performance of simple nursing skills that are appropriate for the profession (for example, personal hygiene, intake and output, bed making, etc.).

You are required to complete **at least 24 clock hours** of hands-on clinical training at a long-term nursing facility. Training is to be supervised by state approved clinical instructors.
